



## The Danish Immigration Service application form guide to the diplomatic missions

### About application forms for Danish residence and work permits

Each of the Immigration Service's application forms for Danish residence and work permits has been developed for a specific type of applicant. When handing out application forms to applicants, diplomatic missions are asked to make sure to hand out the form which matches the applicant's grounds for applying for a Danish residence and work permit.

All application forms contain an application guide with a step-by-step description of the application process and a list of required documents, along with a checklist.

Please note: Some of the forms are *first* to be filled in by the sponsor in Denmark, e.g. an employer or educational institution. This is clearly indicated in the application guide. When the sponsor in Denmark has completed his/her part of the form and attached the necessary documentation, he/she must forward it to the applicant who will then complete the rest of the form, attach the necessary documentation, and submit the entire application at the diplomatic mission. In these cases, diplomatic missions are asked not to hand out the application form but only to receive completed applications or inform applicants of the application process as described above.

<b>Salaried work (non-EU/EEA citizen)</b>	<a href="#">AR1: Application for residence and work permit for employees (non-EU/EEA citizens)</a> . <b>Please note</b> that the employer in Denmark begins the application process by filling in one part of the form before forwarding it to the applicant.
<b>Work as a researcher, PhD student or research assistant</b>	<a href="#">ST2: Application for residence and work permit for researchers, PhD students and research assistants</a> . <b>Please note</b> that the research institution in Denmark begins the application process by filling in one part of the form before forwarding it to the applicant.
<b>Religious work as a member of the clergy, missionary, nun or monk</b>	<a href="#">RF1: Application for a residence and work permit for religious workers</a> . <b>Please note</b> that the religious order/denomination in Denmark begins the application process by filling in one part of the form before forwarding it to the applicant.

<b>Internship in the healthcare sector, natural sciences, technical fields, the pharmaceutical sector, architecture etc.</b>	<a href="#">PR3: Application for a residence and work permit for interns in the healthcare sector, natural sciences, technical fields, the pharmaceutical sector, architecture etc.</a> <b>Please note</b> that the place of internship in Denmark begins the application process by filling in one part of the form before forwarding it to the applicant.

<b>Working Holiday</b>	<a href="#">WH1: Application for residence and work permit for Working Holiday</a>
<b>Humanitarian or social work (or other special circumstances)</b>	<a href="#">XG1: Application for a residence and work permit for volunteers and other applicants with special circumstances</a>
<b>Apply for a Danish residence permit, because the applicant's spouse/partner is to work or study in Denmark</b>	<a href="#">FA8: Application for residence and work permit for family members of a foreign national who is to work or study in Denmark</a> . <b>Please note</b> that children staying with a parent who is to work or study in Denmark also can use this form to apply for a residence permit.
